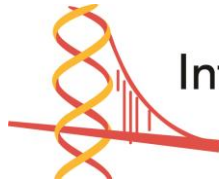

Whether in collaborative practice or mediation, dispute resolution is dangerous because simply *discussing* differences contains the possibility of divergence, separation and loss. Relational conflicts are *especially* dangerous because they are cyclical, chronic, intractable and systemic while at the same time they are intimate, heartfelt, deeply sensitive, highly complex and emotional. This 1-day experiential training focuses on how to deal effectively with the most intractable relational disputes. The format of this training includes lecture, demonstrations, participatory exercises and role plays along with detailed handouts.

In this training you will learn to:

- Differentiate the deeper sources of conflict and alternative definitions of conflict that reveal them
- Analyze the narrative structure of conflict stories
- Learn and apply skills for improving communication at various levels of conflict
- Recognize the ways in which emotional/psychological issues arise in conflict
- Understand the basic neurophysiological mechanisms involved in conflict
- Identify the levels of resolution, from settlement to transcendence
- Improve your own capacity to work effectively with others in emotionally-charged and highly conflicted situations
- Utilize skills for opening heart-to-heart communications, heart-based interventions, working with forgiveness and reconciliation, and designing rituals of release, completion and closure
- Relate the family origins of the parties' conflicts to the dispute being mediated
- Design conflict resolution systems for divorce, marital, family and relational disputes

KENNETH CLOKE, JD, PhD, is one of the nation's foremost conflict resolution professionals and trainers. He is a highly sought-after mediator, speaker, collaborative trainer, author, and a true dispute resolution visionary. He is the Director of the Center for Dispute Resolution, and specializes in resolving complex multi-party conflicts, and provides services in designing conflict resolution systems for organizations. He is the author of many journal articles and the following books: *Conflict Revolution: Mediating Evil, War, Injustice and Terrorism*, *The Crossroads of Conflict: A Journey Into the Heart of Dispute Resolution*, *Mediating Dangerously: The Frontiers of Conflict Resolution*, *Mediation: Revenge and The Magic of Forgiveness*. Kenneth Cloke's education includes a B.A. from the University of California, Berkeley; J.D. from U.C. Berkeley's Boalt Law School; Ph.D. from U.C.L.A.; LL.M. from U.C.L.A. Law School; and did post-doctoral work at Yale University School of Law. He is a graduate of the National Judicial College in Reno, Nevada.

Turn right at the 1st cross street onto Enfrente Road. Turn slight right onto Entrada Drive. Turn right to stay on Entrada Drive to 250 Entrada Drive.

From Santa Rosa - Follow US 101 South to Enfrente Road in Novato. Take the Entrada Drive exit from US 101 South. Turn right onto Enfrente Road. Turn slight right onto Entrada Drive. Turn right to stay on Entrada Drive to 250 Entrada Drive.
